Training

We are training 12 community group representatives from the Louth Leader Partnership and hoping for lots of new community programmes to take to the air in May.

I had the opportunity to speak at the Louth Ethnic Minority Consortium Conference in the Crowne Plaza last Friday morning and there were ten programme ideas from the floor and four people are coming in to record a one hour music show. The programme proposals included current affairs, children's programming, sport, music and history shows which is very encouraging because I expected music programmes, but in fact we are getting presenters who are eager to take part in all genres of programmes in the schedule (and introduce us to great music aswell).

There are nine presenters doing a Level 3 radio course at present so again there will be more programme proposals ready in April.

We are looking for presenters to join all the daytime programmes - Good Morning Dundalk, Town Talk, The Lunchbox, Afternoon Show and Drive Time.
